Worcester AC's Alice Wright will lead the West Midlands challenge at this year's London Mini Marathon on Sunday 17 April after convincingly winning the West Midlands Trial race at Stourport Cycle Track in a time of 17 minutes 38 seconds by a minute from her club mate Jenny Nesbitt.

The 16-year old who has been coached by the former England Junior Cross Country international Dave Walker for four years has developed into one of this country's promising young endurance runners in the last couple of years.

In the third week of January, the 16-year-old endurance runner made a winning international debut for England on the continent in front of more than 5,000 people at the International Juan Muguerza Under 20 Women's race in the town of Elgoibar in the Basque region of Spain. The pace for the first three kilometres in near freezing conditions was controlled by the pre race favourite Zenobia Vangansebe from Belgium who five weeks earlier has accomplished a Top Six finish in the European Junior Championships in Portugal. Despite being the youngest and the most diminutive competitor in the event, the King's School Worcester pupil overtook her Belgian rival to win the race over a 4.5 kilometres course by a margin of five seconds in a time of 15 minutes 55 seconds
